

PM Modi attends opening ceremony of 31st ASEAN Summit



November 13, 2017: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday attended the opening ceremony of the 31st ASEAN Summit in Manila. Earlier on Sunday, Modi interacted with world leaders, including US President Donald Trump, Chinese Premier Li Keqiang and Russian Prime Minister Dmitry Medvedev, at a gala dinner reception hosted by Filipino President Rodrigo Duterte ahead of this year's India-ASEAN and East Asia Summits.

Dalveer Bhandari re-elected to International Court of Justice.



November 21, 2017: India's nominee to International Court of Justice (ICJ) Dalveer Bhandari (70) was re-elected to fifth and the last seat of world court. Bhandari received 183-193 votes in United Nations General Assembly and secured all 15 votes in UN Security Council (UNSC). He was elected after Britain withdrew its candidate from the election. This is the first time since the ICJ was established in 1945 that there will be no British judge in ICJ. Bhandari is fourth Indian judge to be elected to ICJ after B.N. Rau, Nagendra Singh and RS Pathak.

Ivanka Trump at GES 2017: PM Modi Says Women Continue To Lead In India



November 29, 2017: Ivanka Trump, daughter and adviser to US President Donald Trump, arrived in Hyderabad for the annual Global Entrepreneurship Summit co-hosted by India and the US. Ms Trump led a delegation of senior White House officials as well as American entrepreneurs. The theme of this year's summit was 'Women First, Prosperity for All' and included 1,200 young entrepreneurs, and most of them were women.

Industry must pass on lower tax burden



November 25, 2017: The government has pulled out all stops to ensure that customers reap the full benefit of the reduced tax burden on goods and services, as a result of subsuming most indirect taxes under the goods and services tax and then rationalising the tax. It has asked consumer goods companies to carry new, additional price tags on existing stocks. This is welcome. A comparison of the old and new price tags will show if industry has passed on the eliminated tax cascade to consumers by way of lower prices. In another move, tax officers have asked restaurant chains to provide menu prices before and after the rate cuts on GST. Why just chains? All restaurants must comply with the rule, with consumer complaints acting as the trigger for intervention by tax authorities.

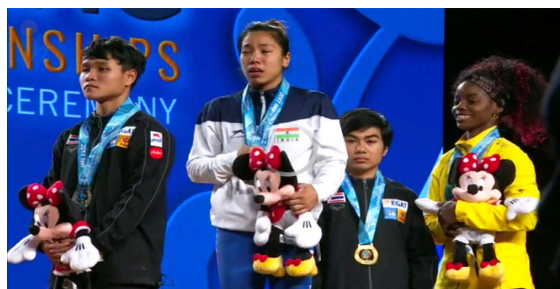

White Day Celebration



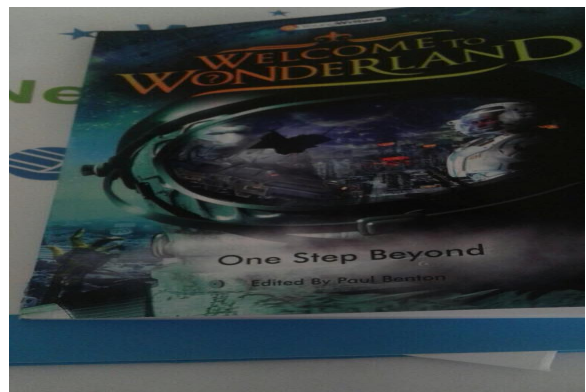

Annual Concert: 7iAwards

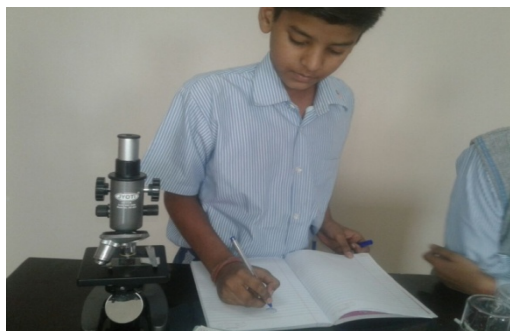

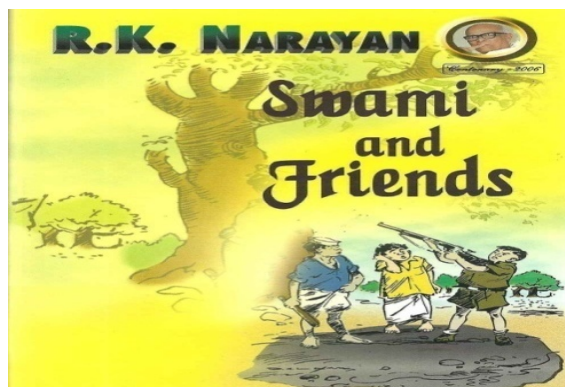


Science Activities



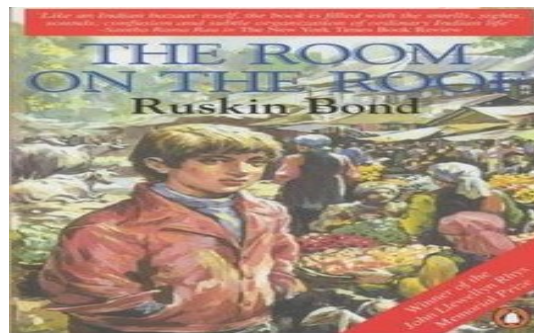
- Students of G5 performed an activity to observe that pressure increases with depth and learnt that water exerts pressure which increases with depth.

The Room on the Roof is a novel written by Ruskin Bond. It was Bond's first literary venture. The novel revolves around Rusty, an orphaned seventeen-year-old Anglo-Indian boy living in Dehradun. Due to his guardian, Mr. Harrison's strict ways, he runs away from his home to live with his Indian friends. Bond wrote the novel when he was seventeen and won the John Llewellyn Rhys Memorial Prize in 1957.
